The textiles ecosystem, encompassing Textiles, Clothing, Leather, and Footwear (TCLF) industries, is critical to Europe's economic landscape but faces significant challenges.



AGEING WORKFORCE

- 42% employees above 50 years old (2022)
- difficulty in attracting young workers



GREEN & DIGITAL SKILLS GAP

- 55% of companies report difficulties filling ICT vacancies
- 40% of companies report green skills gap



GENDER DISPARITY

- workforce dominated by women
- but not in management or senior positions

THE CHALLENGES

European Pact for Skills

November 2020

Initiated by the European Commission, it is one of the flagship actions of the European Skills Agenda. This initiative encourages a collaborative approach involving companies, educational institutions, and government bodies to invest in the lifelong learning of the European workforce.

The Pact is supporting 14 industrial ecosystems through their green and digital transitions.

- Modernised and enhanced the competitiveness of the EU TCLF sectors through sustainable upskilling and reskilling strategies and curricula, improved skills intelligence, and a promotional campaign to attract new talent to the sector



METASKILLS4TCLF

2023 - 2027

- It builds on the previous Blueprint results, offering new curricula and training programs in multiple EU countries (Portugal, Italy, France, Romania, Greece, Poland, Belgium, Sweden, Germany and Ukraine)
- It aims to anticipate emerging skills needs and promote innovative educational resources, VET/HE networks, regional partnerships and a European Virtual Reality Campus

2024 - 2028

- Addresses skills gaps in the TCLF sector, focusing on green and digital skills

- Emphasis on social inclusion, gender balance, and immigration: a more inclusive and diverse workforce in the TCLF industries



TCLF SkillBridge

2024 - 2027

- Working parallelly with the other projects, this project aims to establish regional and local skills partnerships, providing tools, guidelines, events, and support to companies (mainly SMEs) with training and mentorship activities
- It targets several regions relevant to the TCLF sector across Europe, seeking to develop TCLF regional skills partnerships, ensuring a harmonised approach
